Paul Depended on God's Power (2 Cor. 1:8-11)

Paul Experienced Christ's Power (2 Cor. 12:7-10)

2. So We Depend On and Experience His Presence

Moses – "I will be <u>with you</u>" (Exodus 3-4)

Joshua – "The LORD is <u>with you</u> wherever you go." (Joshua 1)

Gideon – "I will be <u>with you</u>." (Judges 6)

Disciples – "I am with you always . . . " (Matthew 28)

Peter – praise and glory and honor (1 Peter 1:3-9)
