Selfless: Paul's Letter to the Romans

Romans 5:1-11 (ESV) – page 942

Having given a detailed explanation of the problem of sin, and the solution found in the Gospel of Jesus Christ, Paul now explains the benefits of the Gospel.

¹Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. ²Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. ³ Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵ and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

⁶ For while we were still <u>weak</u>, at the right time Christ died for the <u>ungodly</u>. ⁷ For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—⁸ but God shows his love for us in that while we were still <u>sinners</u>, Christ died for us. ⁹ Since, therefore, we have now been <u>justified</u> by his blood, much more shall we be <u>saved</u> by him from the <u>wrath of God</u>. ¹⁰ For if while we were <u>enemies</u> we were <u>reconciled</u> to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. ¹¹ More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received <u>reconciliation</u>.

Reflection and Action:

How does understanding the benefits of the Gospel help us "rejoice in our sufferings?" (5:3) Let's rejoice in the benefits we have in Christ even when we don't feel and experience them.
